

Dh35m water supply project completed

Sharjah: Sharjah Electricity and Water Authority (Sewa) has completed a project for water transfer and distribution.

The Dh35-million project entails the distribution of water from Al Layyah and Al Mamzar, which is fed directly from the water desalination and electricity generation station at Al Layaah in Sharjah, through a 32-inch, 10km-long pipeline.

Ebrahim Rashid Dimas, deputy director general of the Authority, said the implementation of the project comes in line with the directives of His Highness Dr Sheikh Sultan Bin Mohammad Al Qasimi, Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Sharjah, and his keenness on providing all the requirements of infrastructure to better serve UAE nationals and residents.

Essam Ameen Al Mullah, the director of the Water Department at the Authority said the new line will contribute to enhancing and strengthening the water transfer and distribution net, and will eliminate all problems related to water shortages around Sharjah and, most importantly, around Al Layyah, Al Mamzar, Al Nadha and the adjacent industrial areas.

Al Mullah also said that work on this particular line is a part of the authority's plans and commercial projects to provide water in Sharjah. He also called upon consumers to conserve water.
