

RO 15m projects in Dakhiliyah

MUSCAT -- The Ministry of Regional Municipalities and Water Resources is implementing a number of developmental projects in the various wilayats of Al Dakhiliyah Region at a cost of more than RO 15 million. The implementation of these projects meets the needs of citizens and provides a decent living.

The government recognises the importance of taking care of the needs of citizens and residents.

Sulaiman Hammad al Jahwari, Director-General of Regional Municipalities and Water Resources in Al Dakhiliyah Region, said the ministry is currently undertaking projects like water (including new dams), the establishment of sewage systems, paving of internal roads and lighting, beautifying entrances to a number of wilayats, in addition to schemes to facilitate smooth flow of traffic.

Nizwa is witnessing the implementation of several service projects, including beautification of the interface of souq and the establishment of a computing hall.

In Al Jabal al Akhdhar work on a network of sewage plant in Seeq and Al Shraiya is under way and the construction of 14 dams for water distribution in Wadi Qatim, Wadi Seeqm, Wadi Bani Habib, Wadi Saqa, Wadi Al Dwaikha and Wadi Al Aswad.

A slaughter house is now being built in Izki and pens for the animals in addition to a fish market and a hall for the computerisation of municipal work are under construction. He added that the Wilayat of Al Hamra witnesses the implementation of a project to develop a business district. It includes paving of the roads, car parking, municipal park and installation of 100 light poles at a distance of 2 km. The road is being paved through the village of Bani Sobh.

There is no doubt that these projects will contribute significantly in advancing the continuous development under the care and attention of His Majesty Sultan Qaboos in the Sultanate, and the Ministry of Regional Municipalities and Water Resources is committed to continue these projects, added Al Jahwari.
